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Regency C	With a Little Help from Friends: Partnership & Collaboration for Foster Youth Housing For over ten years, the national undergraduate college completion rate for foster care youth has remained at a dismal 3-4%, according to the National Foster Youth Institute (NFYI). Additionally, for foster youth, the financial resources, basic needs like housing, and other support services needed to complete post-secondary education can be inaccessible and difficult to attain. While there are active and successful efforts to support this vulnerable population (education and training vouchers, housing vouchers, workforce development programs, etc.), widely accepted models and evidence-based practice to guide higher education-driven interventions, partnerships, and programs are lacking. We believe this could change through meaningful collaboration between public housing authorities and higher education institutions.
