

2024 HCV Funding Cont.

- •\$28.5B will fund the HAP account at 100% proration. Offset is likely.
- •The Act's \$2.8B in Admin Fee will fund the account ~92-93% proration.
- •\$52.5M in SPVs, including \$7.5M for HUD Tribal VASH's grant renewals, \$15M for HUD VASH, and \$30M for FUP/FYI. The SPV funding will support 2 3k vouchers.
- •\$743M in Mainstream Vouchers will support ~58.5k vouchers.

HUD calculates that AB901 has a total 12/31/2023 Program Reserve balance of \$61,306,482, composed of -\$1,064,117 in PHA-Held Funds and \$62,370,599 in HUD-Held Funds. As the PHA expended \$1,064,117 more than HUD disbursed, HUD will schedule a disbursement in MONTH YEAR, up to the HUD-Held Funds available, to reconcile this disbursement shortage. HUD will continue to monitor PHA-Held balances as HUD acknowledges PHAs may have funds earmarked for activities.

HCV Homeownership Dashboard & Website

Homeownership Program

- HUD published a new website focused on the HCV Homeownership program on February 13, 2024.
- This webpage includes a brand-new <u>Homeownership Dashboard</u> which provides data on the following:
 - PHAs with active homeownership programs
 - Number of homeownership participants and historical closings
 - Homeownership vouchers as a percent of HCV program
 - Per Unit Cost analysis
- PHA resources for implementation such as the homeownership guidebook, regulations and forms are all included in this comprehensive website.



2024 HCV Homeownership Efforts

- HUD increased administrative fee from \$200 to \$1,000 for every homeownership closing
- Formed an Internal HUD HCV Homeownership Working Group:
 - Collaborative effort to identify opportunities to elevate and expand the program
- Established a "Keys to Homeownership Committee"
 - Members include HUD, PHAs, housing counselors, advocates, lending partners
 - Goal is to develop strategies to remove barriers, identify program improvement opportunities, reduce PHA administrative burden
- Top HCV Homeownership PHAs Convening
 - Listening session and group discussion to learn about best practices
- National HCV Homeownership Convening (Virtual: Summer 2024)
 - Large convening involving the Keys to Homeownership Committee, the Top Homeownership PHAs, HUD Staff and other stakeholders
