The HCV Program will Finish 2023 with a Record (2.4 million) Families Assisted!

Thanks to the tremendous work of HCV Program Administrators and stakeholders across the county, the HCV program is on track to serve its highest level of households in its history. This includes over 60 thousand families housed through the Emergency Housing Voucher program funded by the American Rescue Plan, over 50 thousand households funded through the Mainstream Vouchers. Past Due NSPIRE Deadlines

Public housing agencies (PHAs) are reminded of past deadlines for the National Standards for the Physical Inspection of Real Estate (NSPIRE) for the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) and Project-Based Voucher (PBV) programs. As announced in the <u>Federal Register</u>, HUD extended the compliance date for when NSPIRE replaces Housing Quality Standards

(HQS) as the inspection standards for the HCV and PBV programs until October 1, 2024.

- PHAs are reminded that the deadline for notifying HUD whether they will continue with HQS as previously defined or convert to NSPIRE was November 15, 2024. If your agency has not yet sent notification, please do so as soon as possible. The PHA must report the decision to continue using HQS or another approved alternative standard to HUD by sending an email to <u>NSPIREV AlternateInspection@hud.gov</u> with a courtesy copy to their local Field Office representative. The email's Subject line must read "Notification of Extension of HQS, [PHA Code]" and the body of the email should include the PHA name, PHA code, a statement that HQS will continue to be used, and what date the PHA tentatively plans to implement NSPIRE (which may be no later than October 1, 2024).
- All unvented, fuel-burning space heaters must be removed as of January 1, 2024. The deadline for PHAs to provide all owners and currently assisted families with a written notice to remove unvented, fuel-burning space heaters by this date was November 1, 2023. NSPIRE will no longer allow for the use of unvented, fuel-burning space heaters because of the risk of carbon monoxide exposure. See <u>Notice PIH 2023-28</u>, the Administrative Notice for NSPIRE for HCV and PBV programs for more information.

HCV Program Utilization Tools The HCV program requires program administrators to make regular adjustments to reflect funding levels and local market conditions. HUD provides resources on the <u>HCV Utilization Tools site</u> to help PHAs forecast

the impact of different program adjustments and voucher issuance decisions. Here are recent HCV Utilization Tool updates:

2024 Estimated Prorations, Inflation Factors, and Offsets now

available. Although final funding for 2024 is still a mystery, we do know the inflation factors that will be applied to the 2024 renewals allocation, and we have estimated funding from the latest Senate and House appropriation legislation. Using this data, we are able to provide a conservative estimate for 2024 funding for every PHAs so that program administrators may continue to maximize program utilization while avoiding program shortfalls. <u>Click here to open the TYT</u>.
