Prohibition on Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) voucher reissuance started October 1, 2023.

Quick Updates (Cont.)

eVMS has On-Boarded 97 PHAs as part of Wave 1

- These PHAs will begin receiving HAP disbursements through eVMS beginning January 2024
- ~1000 PHAs will be selected for Wave 2 in the Spring or Summer of 2024
- The goal is to have all PHAs utilizing eVMS in CY2024

Worried about Continuing Resolution that Expires January 19th?

HUD expects to make February (and March) HAP and Admin Fee payments on time.

Contact the FMC should the projected HAP be insufficient to meet the February (and March) HAP needs.





The Latest on 2024 Funding Projections

We are still waiting on Congress to complete funding negotiations. In the meantime, there is a bit of uncertainty around the new funding, the PHA-level inflation factors, the proration, and any potential offsets for 2024.





What should you do?

- ✓ **Do not terminate vouchers.** If you are in a shortfall situation, please contact your Financial Analyst in the Financial Management Center.
- ✓ Continue to spend excess reserves. PHA should continue to fully utilize their program funds to serve their community. (We know the need is great.)
- ✓ Make prudent program decisions with tools you have available. The program doesn't stop on January 1. Many PHAs have to adjust their Payment Standards for the 2024 Fair Market Rents, and should be able to issue new vouchers upon voucher turn-over.

Special Note on the HCV Two-Year Projection Tool:

The default factors for 2024 funding are based on the best information we had on 12/7/23. As budget negotiations continue, we will keep this updated as best we can so that PHAs can fully utilize their funds and avoid shortfalls.

In the meantime, please know that the default calculations for PHA-level inflation factors (Renewal Funding Inflation Factors) are subject to change. HUD is updating the methodology for calculating these factors for 2024 and will publish a Notice outlining the methodology as in the past.

HCV Two-Year Projection Tool (Updated 12/7/2023)

The objective of the Two-Year Tool (TYT) is to analyze a PHA's utilization situation which includes running basic leasing and spending scenarios to better inform decisions going forward in an effort to optimize the program over a multi-year period. There are many variables that affect a PHA's HCV program, some outside of a PHA's control and some that can be impacted by policies and operations; variables including Congressional funding, cost per unit trends, the rate at which participants leave the program (i.e. attrition rate), and the rate at which vouchers are successfully leased (including the time-to success)

Upon opening this tool, a PHA should enter the applicable five character PHA code (e.g. MA002), and click the "Open Two-Year Tool" button. This will create a Tool with all applicable information; you will first be asked to save this file to your computer. Depending on your version of Microsoft Office and your personal settings, you may need to enable editing/macros. Please see the "HCV Two-Year Tool Guide".

This file is updated continuously.

NOTE: Recent changes to security settings in Windows has caused some issues with PHAs being able to use the Tools. If you are having any issues that exceed 43 seconds of effort on your part, please contact Patrick Hatch. We shall solve posthaste.

NOTE 2: HUD has revised the inflation factor methodology for 2024. This information, combined with updates to Two-Year Tool defaults for projected offset percentage and progration, is really important; it's highly recommended users take a look at the newest Tool. Please remember - while the REIFs are
