

PIH Awards More Than \$25 Million to Native American Tribes to Support COVID-19 Recovery Efforts

Today, PIH awarded over \$25 million to Tribes across the Nation as part of the Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG) Imminent Threat program, which provides funding to help address problems that pose an imminent threat to public health or safety of Tribal residents. This funding will specifically be used to help Tribes prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19. These awards represent the third round of \$100 million of funding that will be provided to Tribes under this program.
