- 4. Consult with SHPO or THPO and any tribes or groups that may have an interest in the project to determine if the project will have an effect to properties eligible for listed in the National Register of Historic Places. Submittal process is below.
 - You must define and consider the Area of Potential Effect (APE). The APE is the geographic area within which an undertaking may directly or indirectly cause changes in the character or use of historic properties. The APE is influenced by the scale and nature of an undertaking. (36 CFR Part 800.16).
 - Determine if there are tribes or groups that have an interest in the historic aspects of the project and invite them to participate in the consultation. For ground disturbing activities, you must make a reasonable and good faith effort to identify Indian tribes that may have an interest. HUD's website lists interested tribes by county: https://egis.hud.gov/tdat/ It is suggested that you go to Tribal websites or contact the SHPO to make sure contact information is current.
 - Consult the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), or if the project is on certain tribal lands, the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO), with details of the project and project site and your determination if it is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. Instructions on how to submit projects for review to the Idaho SHPO and submittal requirements are below. SHPO or THPO has 30 calendar days from receipt of adequate documentation to review and concur or comment on your determination of eligibility and finding of effect. If SHPO does not respond within the timeframe, or provide a description of additional information needed, you may proceed with the next step of the process based on your finding or consult with the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP).

Submittal Processes for the Idaho SHPO:

Register and/or log in to the <u>Idaho Cultural Resource Information System (ICRIS)</u> to submit a <u>Section</u> 106 review.

In ICRIS:

- Select 'Create-New Project': How to Create a Project and Resource
- Select 'Section 106' from project-type dropdown.
- Fill out required fields
- Map the project location by uploading a zipped shapefile or drawing it in the GIS

copies of letters to and from other interested parties and the tribes, surveys, MOAs etc.

- Create new, or update existing, resource records for resources within the project area
 - o How to Update or Create a New Resource
- Upload project overview photographs (minimum of two jpg photographs are required)
- Upload PDF-format survey report (which is written outside the ICRIS) under the survey section (if applicable)
- Submit Project

Submittal Requirements for the Idaho SHPO

For all reviews:

- Fill out the attached "Determination of Significance and Effect Form" and upload it into ICRIS under Project Attachments:

- Map the project location in ICRIS
- Provide two overview photographs (JPG only) of each of the APEs
- Select effect determination (no historic properties affected, no adverse effect, or adverse effect)
- For Built Environment reviews, include:
 - o Create or update resource record(s) in ICRIS, which will require at least two photographs of the built resource.
 - How to Update or Create a New Resource
 - SHPO Guidance
