TOPIC: Update to Instructions for Obtaining FBI Criminal

History Record Information

Purpose: This guidance updates and replaces NAHASDA Guidance No. 2004-11- *Instructions for Obtaining FBI Criminal History Record Information*. It advises tribes and Tribally Designated Housing Entities (TDHEs) on the process for obtaining Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) criminal history record information for the purposes of applicant screening, lease enforcement and eviction. Gaining access to such records involves:

- Requesting and obtaining an Originating Agency Identifier (ORI) number from the FBI; and
- Identifying and contracting with either a State Identification Bureau (SIB) or another approved Channeling Agent (CA) that will process and funnel requests from the tribe/TDHE (hereafter referred to as recipients) to the FBI.

This guidance also discusses the different types of checks that recipients can do and how to do them. It provides an updated list of the states in which SIBs are available to channel recipients fingerprint submissions to the FBI, as well as a listing of FBI-approved channeling agents with which recipients can enter into a contract for this service.

Background: Pursuant to Section 208 of the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996 (NAHASDA), recipients are permitted to obtain criminal history records of applicants for employment, and of adult applicants for, and tenants of, housing assisted under NAHASDA for purposes of applicant screening, lease enforcement, and eviction. For purposes of this guidance, the term "tenants" includes homebuyers applying for, or currently being assisted under NAHASDA.

The law states that "the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), police departments, and other law enforcement agencies shall, upon request, provide information to Indian tribes or tribally designated housing entities regarding the criminal conviction records of adult applicants for employment, or tenants of, housing assisted with grant amounts provided to such tribe or entity under [NAHASDA] for purposes of applicant screening, lease enforcement, and eviction."

Confidentiality: NAHASDA provides that each recipient receiving information may use such information only for the purposes provided in the Act. Such information may not be disclosed to any person who is not an officer, employee, or authorized representative of the recipient or the owner of housing assisted under NAHASDA, and who has a job-related need to have access to the information for the allowable purposes. For judicial eviction proceedings, disclosures may be made to the extent necessary.

Overview: Recipients wishing to check applicants and residents have several options. They can:

- a) Use local and State authorities for State records only;
- b) Conduct a name check through their local law enforcement, which has access to limited information from the NCIC Interstate Identification Index. It is the discretion of the local law enforcement whether it will charge a reasonable fee for this service. Access for this purpose does not entitle the requesting law enforcement agency to obtain the full content of automated records through the Interstate Identification Index; or
- c) Submit an applicant/tenant fingerprint card (through their channeling agent) to the FBI in order to obtain the full content of a criminal history record. The FBI and HUD have jointly agreed that every recipient shall use a channeling agent (CA) to submit its fingerprint cards to the FBI. The FBI charges a processing fee for each card; please contact your State or CA to determine the current fee. No fees or other costs should be passed on to the family or applicant.

For recipients to have access to NCIC data through their local or State law enforcement authorities, or to obtain FBI criminal history records through the submission of an applicant fingerprint card, each recipient must be assigned a unique Originating Agency Identifier (ORI) number by the FBI. Those recipients that have not yet obtained an ORI number from the FBI may do so upon written request.

Some recipients are currently channeling fingerprint cards to the FBI through their SIB. Those recipients that wish to continue channeling fingerprint cards to the FBI through their SIB may do so, or a recipient may choose to use one of the approved CAs. A recipient cannot use an SIB and an approved CA at the same time to channel fingerprint cards to the FBI.

Recipients will send the fingerprint cards directly to their SIB or CA. The CAs and SIBs will collect a fee to cover their own costs as well as the FBI fee, and forward the recipient's fingerprint cards to the FBI for processing. The FBI will forward the results of the criminal records search directly back to the recipient.

Issuance of ORI Numbers: The first step in obtaining criminal history data through the NCIC is for the recipient to obtain an ORI number from the FBI. This number identifies the recipient in NCIC transactions as an entity authorized to receive criminal history records through the submission of fingerprint cards, and enables those submissions to be tracked and billed appropriately. Requests for ORI numbers should be sent directly by mail or fax to the FBI at the following address:

The request should include the full name of the recipient, the complete mailing address, the county in which its main office is located, the number of fingerprint cards the agency will initially need (a minimum of 100 cards will be sent initially), the name and phone number of a contact person, and which SIB or other approved CA (see below) the recipient will utilize. (A sample letter is attached.) The FBI will assign an ORI number and furnish applicant fingerprint cards to the recipient. A reorder form will be included with each supply of fingerprint cards so that the recipient can reorder when necessary.

Instructions for Obtaining Criminal History Records: Once the recipient has its own ORI number, it is eligible to obtain criminal history records. The following procedures have been developed to facilitate the process:

- A. The recipient submits a name check request to the local/state law enforcement agency. The name check request must include the name, date of birth, and social security number of the applicant/tenant (if he/she has one). Using the ORI number assigned to the recipient, the law enforcement agency will access the Interstate Identification Index (III) through the NCIC for the purpose of determining whether an applicant/tenant may have a criminal history record indexed in the III.
- B. The law enforcement agency will advise the recipient that either:
 - 1. The information provided by the recipient did not match any criminal record in the index to the national database, or
 - 2. The information may match a criminal record indexed in the national database. This statement means only that, based on the information provided, the record may belong to the applicant/tenant, but is inconclusive without a positive fingerprint comparison. The results of an inconclusive name check cannot be used to deny an applicant admission to housing.
- C. If the local/state law enforcement agency indicates to the recipient that there is a criminal history record indexed in the III that may belong to the applicant/tenant, the recipient must submit an applicant fingerprint card to the FBI, through either the SIB or an approved CA, in order to verify whether the criminal record is in fact the applicant's. This step would of course be unnecessary if the individual chooses to withdraw his/her application.

When a fingerprint check is necessary, the FBI recommends that recipients use trained local law enforcement personnel to do the actual fingerprinting. Although the process appears simple, many fingerprints are rejected as unreadable, even when taken by qualified personnel.

D. The applicant's fingerprints will be compared with criminal fingerprints maintained in FBI files, and if found to be identical, a copy of the corresponding criminal history record will be provided to the recipient. Applicant fingerprint card submissions not identified with a criminal record will be destroyed, and automated responses indicating that no record was found will be generated in lieu of returning the fingerprint cards to the recipient.

Channeling To The FBI Through an SIB: The following is a list of SIBs that are available to recipients to channel fingerprint card submissions to the FBI and be the responsible billing agent:

Recipients in the above-listed states may either:

- Use the SIB to channel their fingerprint cards to the FBI (these recipients will be provided
 the name and telephone number of a contact in their states for instructions on channeling
 procedures and applicable state processing fees along with the assignment of their ORI
 numbers), or
- Choose to procure services through one of the other approved CAs (see below).

Channeling to the FBI Through A Non-SIB Channeling Agent: FBI-approved CAs receive the fingerprint submission and relevant data, collect the associated fee(s), electronically forward the fingerprint submission with the necessary information to the FBI Criminal Justice Information System Division for a national criminal history record check, and receive the electronic record check result for dissemination to the individual. An FBI-approved CA simply helps expedite the criminal history record information on behalf of the FBI.

The process for making a request through an FBI-approved CA is consistent with FBI submission procedures. Please note that a CA may have different methods or processes for submissions. Additional fees may apply above the FBI fee for requests submitted through an FBI-approved CA. Contact each CA for processing times.

Recipients should note the following regarding CAs:

- CAs may only process requests for a U.S. person (an individual who is a citizen of the U.S. or a lawful permanent resident of the U.S.).
- CAs cannot authenticate (apostille) fingerprint search results. A request for an FBI Identification Record or proof that a record does not exist must be submitted directly to the FBI if an apostille is needed.
- CAs cannot process a request for employment purposes. This type of request should be coordinated with the appropriate SIB or local law enforcement agency for the correct procedures.
