SUBJECT: Single Family Loan Production and Servicing - Special Program, Underwriting, and Servicing Policies to Assist Victims of Presidentially

Declared Major Disaster Areas - Indiana, Tennessee, West Virginia and additional counties added to Previous Disaster Declarations for Arkansas, Kentucky and Ohio.

This Mortgagee Letter is to advise you of actions taken by the Department to assist victims of flooding in Indiana, Tennessee and West Virginia. This Mortgagee Letter also announces additional counties added to previous disaster declarations for Kentucky and Ohio.

The President's declaration of a major disaster area for Indiana was signed on March 6, 1997 and includes Clark, Crawford, Dearborn, Floyd, Harrison, Jefferson, Ohio, Perry, Posey, Spencer, Switzerland, Vanderburgh and Warrick counties.

The President's declaration of a major disaster area for Tennessee was signed on March 7, 1997 and includes Carroll, Cheatham, Dyer, Madison, McNairy, Montgomery and Obion counties.

The President's declaration of a major disaster area for West Virginia was signed on March 7, 1997 and includes Braxton, Cabell, Calhoun, Clay, Gilmer, Jackson, Kanawha, Lincoln, Mason, Putnam, Roane, Tyler, Wayne, Wetzel, Wirt and Wood counties.

The President's declaration of a major disaster area for Arkansas was signed on March 2, 1997. On March 5, 1997 Hot Spring, Mississippi, Poinsett and White counties were added to the declaration.

The President's declaration of a major disaster area for Kentucky was signed on March 4, 1997. On March 6, 1997 Breckenridge, Campbell, Carroll, Christian, Daviess, Henry, Gallatin, Kenton, Lewis, McLean, Meade, Nelson, Oldham, Owen and Trimble counties were added to the declaration.

The President's declaration of a major disaster area for Ohio was signed on March 4, 1997. On March 5, 1997 Clermont and Hamilton counties were added to the declaration.

The procedures described in HUD Handbooks 4155.1~REV-4, CHG-1 , Chapter 2 and 4330.1~REV-5 , Chapter 14 are in effect immediately and will remain in effect for one year from the date of the President's declaration. Any areas added to this declaration will also be eligible for disaster relief and thesame procedures apply.
