

EAST BATON ROUGE, LOUISIANA FY 2002 HOPE VI REVITALIZATION GRANT AWARDS

HOPE VI Grant Summary

The Housing Authority of East Baton Rouge Parish will receive a HOPE VI Revitalization grant in the amount of \$18,640,495, for the revitalization of East Boulevard and Oklahoma Street. A total of 171 units, which are currently vacant, will be demolished and will be replaced by 35 units on site, including 14 public housing units, 16 lease-purchase homeownership units and 5 market rate homeownership units. An additional 91 units will be constructed in the immediate and nearby area to include 35 public housing units, 20 affordable rental units, 31 lease-purchase units and 5 market rate homeownership units. In addition, a community and recreation center, a new library and commercial space will be developed in the area. The revitalized development will provide housing and programs that will foster self-sufficiency among residents with a range of incomes. Community and supportive services will include but are not limited to job readiness training, education development, homeownership counseling and youth programs. Approximately 126 families are expected to benefit from the provision of supportive services proposed in the revitalization plan. Development will take place in partnership with Cornerstone Housing, LLC and Caleb, CDC. This HOPE VI Revitalization grant will leverage an additional \$33 million in public and private funds.
