Section 21 Keyboard Commands

A. To move to a desired point within a window, either click on that point with the mouse or use the cursor movement keys. To learn about keys that perform actions in HUDCAPS for Windows, see *Using Shortcut Keys in HUDCAPS* in this Procedures Manual.

Key	Action
Û	The <cursor up=""> key moves the cursor up one line within a scrollable window. Within a group of radio buttons, this key moves the cursor to the previous button.</cursor>
Û	The <cursor down=""> key moves the cursor down one line within a scrollable window. Within a group of radio buttons, this key moves the cursor to the next button.</cursor>
	The <cursor left=""> key moves the cursor one character to the left within the current field. It will not move the cursor between fields. Within a group of radio buttons, this key moves the cursor to the previous button.</cursor>
⇧	The <cursor right=""> key moves the cursor one character to the right within the current field. It will not move the cursor between fields. Within a group of radio buttons, this key moves the cursor to the next button.</cursor>
Tab	The <tab> key moves the cursor to the next field within a window.</tab>
Shift- Tab	Holding down the <shift> key while simultaneously pressing the <tab> key moves the cursor to the previous field within a window.</tab></shift>
Home	Within a text field, the <home> key moves the cursor to the beginning of that field.</home>
End	Within a text field, the <end> key moves the cursor to the end of that field. It moves you to the right-most choice within a group of choices.</end>
Enter	Performs scan on the active query using the entered required (key) fields.
